

Why You Still Need Human Intervention

AI writes with patterns, not wisdom.

It might suggest a buzzword-filled resume or too-generic email if you don't add specific context or review carefully.

Human touch = trust.

Hiring managers and recruiters can tell when a message is overly polished or impersonal. You still need to show enthusiasm, care, and realness.

It won't always know what's ethical.

For example, AI might exaggerate results or recommend inflating skills —always fact-check, edit, and stay honest.

AI + YOU = Job Search Superpower


Let AI do the heavy lifting, formatting, and first drafts.

Then step in to personalize, refine, and connect the dots.

That's how you'll stand out—not just as qualified, but as someone they want on the team.



TOP AI TOOLS FOR JOB SEEKERS: USE CASES & LIMITATIONS



AI isn't one-size-fits-all—different tools excel at different tasks. Here's a breakdown of the most useful tools for job searching, what they're great at, and where to be careful.

ChatGPT (OpenAI)

Best For:

- Generating resume bullets, cover letters, and outreach messages
- Interview simulations and salary negotiation scripts
- Career clarity exercises (e.g., job title comparisons, pathfinding)
- Summarizing job descriptions and company info

Watch Out For:

- May sound generic or robotic without clear input
- Doesn't always include the latest data (check version $\ensuremath{\mathcal{C}}$ cutoff)
- Can "hallucinate" facts (always fact-check!)



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Pro Tip:

The more specific your prompt, the better your result. Always include your role, goal, and tone.



TOP AI TOOLS

Teal HQ

Best For:

- Tracking job applications and contacts
- Tailoring resumes to job descriptions
- Saving and organizing AI-generated content (e.g., interview stories, notes)

Watch Out For:

- The resume builder can sometimes over-template your content
- Not ideal for highly specialized formatting (e.g., design-heavy resumes)

Pro Tip:

Use the Chrome extension to instantly analyze job descriptions and identify missing keywords.

Rezi

Best For:

- ATS-optimized resume creation
- Building role-specific resumes from scratch
- Keyword matching and bullet suggestions



TOP AI TOOLS

♠ Watch Out For:

- Limited customization unless you upgrade
- Writing can feel stiff—always edit for tone and flow

Pro Tip:

Use Rezi for structure and formatting, then refine your content in ChatGPT or manually.



Yoodli

Best For:

- Practicing interview answers with real-time feedback
- Improving filler words, tone, and pace
- Mock interviews in a low-pressure setting

Watch Out For:

- May not always replicate industry-specific questions
- Lacks human warmth—don't become overly "scripted"

Pro Tip:

Use Yoodli to smooth out nerves and delivery, then test your answers live with a friend or coach.



TOP AI TOOLS



Google's Interview Warmup

Best For:

- Practicing role-based interview questions (tech, UX, data, etc.)
- Getting sample answers and reviewing patterns in your replies
- Quick practice sessions

Watch Out For:

- No personalized feedback or suggestions
- Limited roles and industries

Pro Tip:

Use this as your "pre-game warmup" before deeper mock interview sessions in ChatGPT or with people.

LinkedIn's AI Features

Best For:

- Auto-generating profile summaries and headlines
- Helping draft InMail messages or posts
- Discovering trending roles and skillsith your unique voice, values, and key wins.



TOP AI TOOLS

! Watch Out For:

- Auto-written summaries often sound robotic or vague
- No nuance or storytelling—use only as a baseline

Pro Tip:

Use the AI-generated draft, then personalize it with your unique voice, values, and key wins.



Jobscan

Best For:

- Matching your resume against a job description
- Identifying missing keywords or skills
- Scoring your chances of passing ATS filters

Watch Out For:

- Too much focus on "keyword stuffing" can hurt readability
- Not a writing tool—it's an evaluator

Pro Tip:

Use it post-edit to audit your resume, not as your only optimization step.



TOP AI TOOLS

Notion + AI

Best For:

- Creating job search dashboards and application trackers
- Organizing AI-generated ideas, prompts, and strategies
- Journaling and reflection with AI assistance

Watch Out For:

- Not intuitive for first-time users
- AI writing inside Notion isn't as advanced as ChatGPT yet

Pro Tip:

Combine Notion + ChatGPT for power: use Notion to stay organized, ChatGPT to generate and refine content.

1. INTRO TO AI IN THE JOB SEARCH

2. USING AI TO CLARIFY YOUR CAREER GOALS

From Overwhelmed to Focused

Before you start applying, get clear on what kind of work lights you up and aligns with your experience. Al can guide this process by mirroring back your strengths and showing you paths you haven't considered.

✓ How to Use AI for Career Clarity:

- 1. Reflect on your wins Ask ChatGPT to help you extract patterns from your past roles.
- 2. Explore transitions Use it to map adjacent roles, industries, or hybrid skill sets.
- 3. Simulate job matches Feed your resume and ask what types of jobs you're best aligned for.



Prompt to try:

"Here's a list of my recent projects. What are 3 career paths that would align with these experiences? [Paste project list]"

Pro Tip: Add context like salary goals, work style (remote vs. inoffice), and personal values to get richer output.



3. AI-POWERED RESUME OPTIMIZATION

Your Resume = Your Strategic Marketing Asset

A resume isn't your life story—it's your entry ticket. AI can help you customize resumes at scale, optimize for applicant tracking systems (ATS), and highlight the skills that matter.

X Tools That Help:

- TealHQ Job-specific resume versions and keyword tracking
- Rezi ATS-optimized resume builder
- ChatGPT Tailored rewrites and resume summaries
- Jobscan Matches your resume against real job descriptions

"Take this resume summary and align it with the following job description. Highlight key skills they're likely prioritizing: [Paste resume + job description]"

Common AI Resume Wins:

- Shortening bullet points for clarity
- Turning responsibilities into quantifiable impact
- Adding missing keywords from job posts

▲ Warning: AI tools won't always understand nuance or context. Always review for tone, relevance, and accuracy.



4. WRITING BETTER COVER LETTERS WITH AI

Make It Easy to Start. Then Make It Personal.

Writing a fresh, targeted cover letter for every job is exhausting. But AI can give you a fast, structured first draft—and save you hours per application.

📏 AI Writing Framework:

- 1. Why them? Mention the company's mission or recent work

- 4. **Close with confidence** Thank them and invite action



☑ Prompt to try:

"Write a concise, enthusiastic cover letter for a UX designer role at a fintech startup. Emphasize my experience with accessibility and passion for user-centered design."

▲ Keep It Ethical:

Never use AI-generated letters as-is. Always:

- Customize personal anecdotes
- Verify company details
- Inject your authentic voice



5. JOB DESCRIPTIONS: DECODING & MATCHING WITH AI

Turn Wordy Listings into Actionable Intel

Job descriptions are full of fluff—but they also contain gold. AI can break them down into:

- Core responsibilities
- Required skills and technologies
- Cultural clues
- Keywords for resume matching

Prompt to try:

"Analyze this job description. What are the top 10 keywords I should include on my resume to align with it?"

Smart Use Cases:

- Create a checklist before applying
- Tailor each resume version based on extracted keywords
- Predict potential interview topics

Advanced Tip:

Ask ChatGPT: "Rewrite my resume bullets to emphasize the competencies in this job posting. Highlight impact and results."



6. PREPARING FOR INTERVIEWS USING AI

Simulate, Refine, Repeat

AI interview prep is like having a personal coach—available 24/7. It won't judge you, and it never gets tired of mock questions.

✓ How to Use It:

- Practice STAR-format answers
- Roleplay interviews (technical + behavioral)
- Simulate recruiter calls or "Tell me about yourself" intros
- Get feedback on clarity, tone, and structure

★ What's STAR Format?

STAR stands for Situation, Task, Action, Result—a proven framework for telling compelling, structured stories in interviews.

- **Situation** Set the scene. What was going on?
- **Task** What were you responsible for?
- Action What specific steps did you take?
- **Result** What was the outcome? Bonus if you can quantify success.

Example:

"We were missing sprint deadlines (Situation), and as the lead, I was tasked with identifying the bottleneck (Task). I created a daily sync and used a Kanban board to visualize blockers (Action), which improved team velocity by 40% in two weeks (Result)."



6. PREPARING FOR INTERVIEWS USING AI

Prompt to try:

"Act as a hiring manager. Ask me 5 behavioral questions for a senior cloud engineer. After each response, give me feedback on how I could improve."

® Bonus Use: Ask AI to guess what questions are likely based on the job description or company values.





7. SALARY RESEARCH & NEGOTIATION SCRIPTS WITH AI

Know Your Market. Ask with Confidence.

Negotiating your salary starts before you get the offer. AI tools can help you:

- Benchmark salaries by region, role, and company
- Write persuasive negotiation emails
- Roleplay tough conversations

Prompt to try:

"Draft a polite but firm email asking for a \$10K increase based on market data. Mention a competing offer but keep the tone positive."

Research Tools:

- Levels.fyi (tech roles)
- Blind (anonymized employee insights)
- Glassdoor, BuiltIn, Comparably
- ChatGPT (for script creation)

Bonus Prompt:

"Act as a compensation expert. What is the current salary range for a data analyst with 5 years of experience in Boston?"



8. USING AI TO RESEARCH COMPANIES & ROLES

Show Up Informed, Not Just Interested

AI can digest dense company websites, news, and LinkedIn pages to prepare you for interviews or strategic outreach.

What to Research:

- Recent product launches or acquisitions
- Leadership insights or investor trends
- Team culture and company values
- Competitor positioning

Prompt to try:

"Summarize this company's recent news and key values. What questions could I ask to show I've done my homework? [Paste company site or links]"

4 Use it to craft better follow-ups:

"Based on what I learned from your recent cloud migration initiative, I'd love to understand how your team is approaching DevSecOps..."



9. AUTOMATING YOUR JOB SEARCH WORKFLOW

Save Time. Reduce Stress. Stay Organized.

Between applications, follow-ups, interviews, and networking—it's easy to drop the ball. Use AI and simple tools to create a clean, repeatable process.

Tools to Combine:

- **TealHO** Job tracker with notes and templates
- **Notion / Trello** Custom boards for stages and tasks
- **Google Sheets + ChatGPT** Use AI to generate follow-up messages, summaries
- **Zapier or Make** Automate reminders or syncs

Prompt to try:

"Help me design a job search tracker in Notion. I want columns for role, status, last contact, next step, and notes."

Ö Time-Saving Prompts:

"Create a weekly schedule for job search activities including networking and skills refresh."

"Draft a follow-up message after a secondround interview for a data engineering role."





10. ETHICAL & SMART **USE OF AI IN YOUR JOB SEARCH**

Use It as a Partner. Not a Shortcut.

AI is an enhancer—not a replacement for your voice, credibility, or intent. The most successful job seekers use it thoughtfully, not lazily.

✓ Best Practices:

- Always add your own insight and story
- Double-check for tone, accuracy, and authenticity
- Keep confidential info out of prompts
- Avoid copying answers into applications verbatim

→ Rule of Thumb:

If you wouldn't say it • Faking experience face-to-face, don't let AI say it for you.

⚠ Red Flag Uses:

- Using AI to write code challenges
- Inflating roles or results

1. Career Clarity & Pivoting

Prompts:

"Based on my experience as a [job title], what adjacent roles or career paths could I consider if I want to pivot into [industry]?"

"Here are my top 5 skills and 3 favorite work experiences. What career options align with these strengths?"

"Compare the roles of data analyst, business analyst, and product analyst. Which might be the best fit if I enjoy storytelling with data and working cross-functionally?"

"What job titles match someone with [5] years of experience in frontend development who wants to move into product management?"s.



AI PROMPT LIBRARY

"Act as a career coach. Help me decide between staying in my current industry or transitioning into AI/ML. What are the trade-offs and requirements?"

Bonus Tip: Add your goals (remote work, leadership roles, creative projects) to guide the AI toward aligned suggestion

2. Resume Editing & Tailoring

Best for: Keyword alignment, formatting improvements, quantifying impact.

- "Rewrite these 3 resume bullets to align with this job description.

 Focus on results and active verbs. [Paste bullets + job description]"
- "Convert these project tasks into resume accomplishments using the STAR format. [Paste project description]"
- "Add metrics to this resume bullet where possible: 'Led team migration to cloud-based infrastructure.'"
- "Identify missing skills or keywords in this resume based on the following job posting. Suggest changes. [Paste resume + job description]"
- "Simplify and improve the formatting of this resume to make it easier to scan in 6 seconds."
- **Bonus Tip:** Always edit AI output for tone and truth—don't let it overhype or misrepresent.

3. Interview Prep

▼ Best for: Mock interviews, STAR responses, storytelling, and practicing confidence.

- "Simulate a technical interview for a [job title] at a SaaS company.

 Ask 5 questions and provide feedback on each of my responses."
- "Generate 5 behavioral interview questions for a leadership role in IT consulting. Then help me outline STAR-format answers."
- "Act as a recruiter. Ask me 'Tell me about yourself,' then give suggestions to make my response more compelling."
- "What are the top interview questions likely to be asked for a remote-first senior DevOps role?"
- "Based on this job description, what interview questions should I be prepared for?"
- **Bonus Tip:** Roleplay tough questions like "Why did you leave your last job?" or "Tell me about a failure."

4. Networking Outreach

▼ Best for: LinkedIn messages, email outreach, reconnecting with former colleagues.

- "Write a friendly and professional LinkedIn message to reconnect with a former coworker and let them know I'm job searching."
- "Draft a short message to a LinkedIn connection I've never met, asking for a quick 15-minute virtual coffee to learn about their team."
- "Help me write a LinkedIn post to announce that I'm open to new opportunities after a layoff. Keep the tone optimistic and authentic."
- "Write a follow-up thank-you note after an informational interview. Mention 1 takeaway and express interest in staying connected."
- "Create a message I can send to a former manager to ask if they'd be open to acting as a reference."
- **Bonus Tip:** Ask AI to "personalize this more" or "make it warmer" if the message feels too generic.

5. Negotiation Language

Best for: Counter-offers, salary transparency, equity questions, or flexible work terms.

- "Draft a professional email to ask for a salary increase based on market benchmarks and added responsibilities."
- "Write a response to a job offer asking if there's room to negotiate on compensation or signing bonus."
- "What's a respectful way to bring up equity or stock options in a startup offer conversation?"
- "Give me a script for a phone call where I ask for 10% more than the initial offer due to cost-of-living and competing offers."
- "Write a message thanking the employer for the offer and requesting 48 hours to review while I consider competing opportunities."
- **Bonus Tip:** Al can also roleplay difficult conversations with hiring managers or recruiters—just ask it to simulate the back-and-forth.

Pro Prompting Tips

- ◆ **Always give context:** Your role, goals, values, and audience
- **Refine output:** "Make it more concise," "Add confidence," or "Sound less formal"
- **Use follow-ups:** Great prompting is often iterative. Don't stop after one run!
- **Check for accuracy:** Especially if AI mentions numbers, companies, or industry-specific facts
 - ◆ **Inject your voice:** Let AI be your ghostwriter, not your ghost

USING 1-800-CHATGPT

K How to Set It Up for the Best Results

1. Use ChatGPT Mobile App

- Download the ChatGPT app on iOS or Android
- Ensure you're using **GPT-5 with Voice Mode** (Pro version required)
- Tap the headphones icon for to begin a live voice session

2. Set the Context Right Away

• Start the call by telling ChatGPT exactly what role and level you're targeting.

Say:

"Hi ChatGPT, I want to simulate a phone interview for a mid-level data analyst role at a fintech company. Please act as the hiring manager and ask me realistic interview questions. After each answer, give me feedback on my clarity, tone, and completeness."

3. Be Honest and Specific in Your Answers

• Treat the simulation like a real interview. Pause, think, and answer out loud in full sentences.

4. Ask for Feedback or Follow-Up

After answering, prompt it to coach you.

Say:

"How could I improve that answer?" | "Did I ramble too much?" | "Was my STAR format clear?"



USING 1-800-CHATGPT

5. Use Reflection Mode Afterward

End the session and immediately jot down notes in a job search journal or Notion doc:

- What felt strong?
- What was clunky or unclear?
- What stories felt incomplete?

Example Call Flow: What to Say to ChatGPT

You Say: "Hi ChatGPT, I'm preparing for a job interview for a senior UX designer role. Can we do a voice-based mock interview? Ask me common behavioral and role-specific questions and give feedback on how I can improve."

ChatGPT Responds (Live):

"Of course! Let's begin. Tell me about a time you had to balance user needs with tight technical constraints..."

Limitations to Keep in Mind

- It won't read your body language or facial expressions
- Feedback may still be surface-level—don't skip human feedback when possible
- You'll need to self-reflect and tweak based on AI cues
- Not ideal for hyper-technical whiteboard interviews (better for soft skills and storytelling)



USING 1-800-CHATGPT

Pro Tips

- Practice in 10–15 minute sprints to build fluency
- Use it the morning of your interview as a warm-up
- Pair with Yoodli or record your own responses for self-review
- Use different voices or personas to simulate recruiter vs. technical vs. hiring manager

→ Final Thought:

You're not just practicing answers—you're building confidence. The best interviewers aren't the smartest—they're the clearest, calmest, and most compelling.

Use tools like 1-800-ChatGPT to practice how you show up, not just what you say.
